*Please note: only includes data through July 2008.

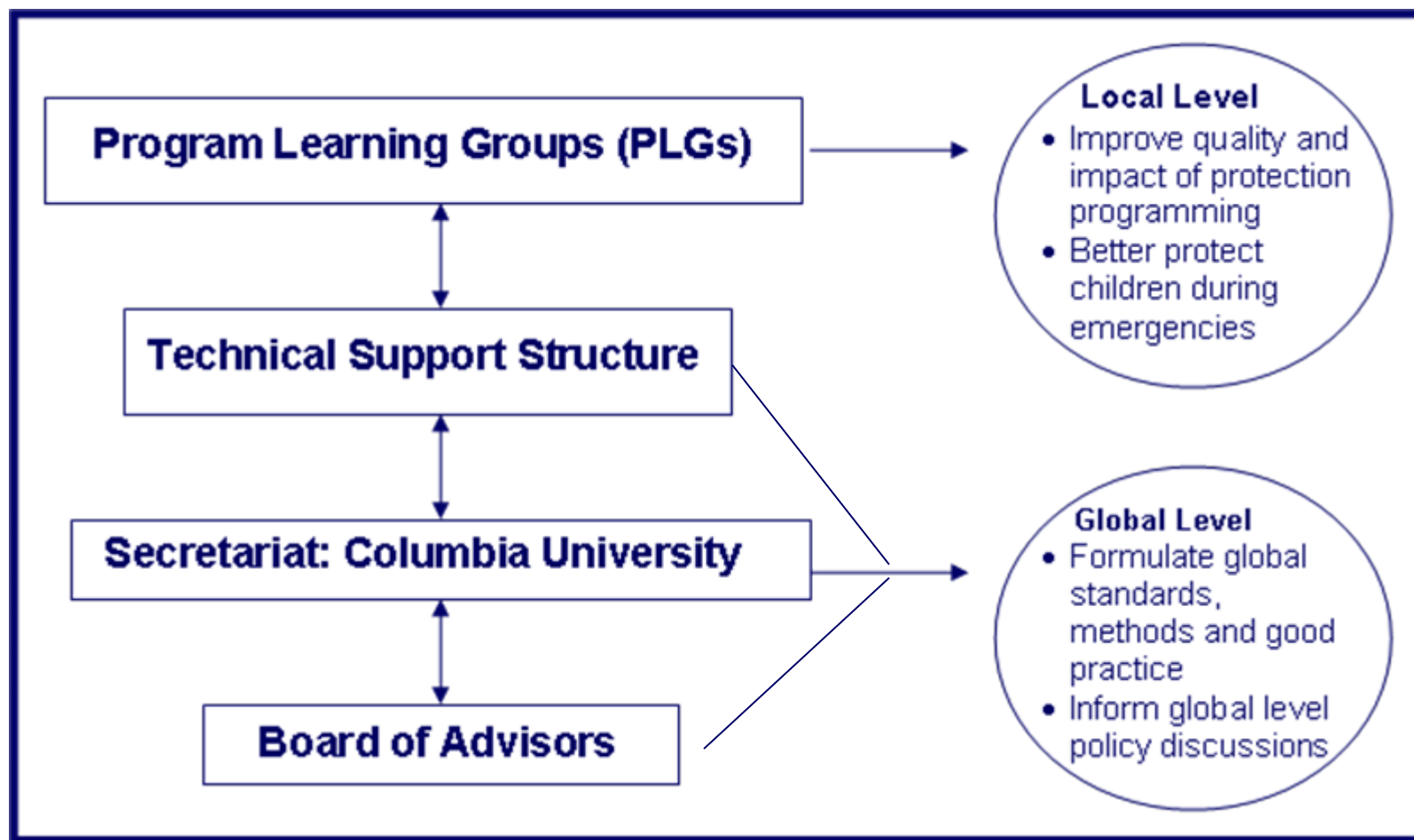
Goal of CPC Learning Network
